MMT Grading System

Manual Muscle Testing(MMT) is a method diagnostic evaluation used by physical therapists, chiropractors, physiological researchers and others concerned with establishing effective treatment and tracking progress throughout a

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specific regimen. The evolution of current methods of manual muscle testing can be traced back to the early 1900s, when gravity tests were used to assess spinal nerve damage.

This table provides a preferred order to the testing of muscle groups for manual

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muscle testing.

Generally, for bilateral muscle testing, each muscle group is first tested on the right and then the left, prior to proceeding to the next muscle group in the list. Some muscle groups are listed here with anti-gravity testing, but for a weaker ...

MMT- 8 is a set of 8

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designated muscles tested unilaterally (potential score 0-70) or bilaterally (potential score 0-140). Axial (neck flexors) testing is included, so that potential MMT8 score = 80 or 150 . Muscle Groups . Right (0 - 10)

The most commonly accepted method of evaluating muscle strength is the Oxford Scale (AKA Medical Research Council Manual Muscle Testing scale). This method involves testing key muscles from the

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upper and lower extremities against the examiner's resistance and grading the patient's strength on a 0 to 5 scale accordingly [1] :
